A United Effort: ORFW's Triumph in Gathering Signatures Against Ranked Choice Voting

The Oregon Federation of Republican Women (ORFW) has always been a force to be reckoned with when it comes to representing our values and ensuring that our voices are heard. Our recent campaign to gather signatures for our opposition statement against Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) in the Oregon State Voters Pamphlet is a shining example of what we can achieve when we work together.

Our goal was ambitious: collect 600 signatures from across the state to ensure that our opposition to RCV is presented clearly and powerfully to Oregon voters. Nevertheless, our women were instrumental in helping the Washington County Republicans succeed with their opposition statements.

Special recognition goes to the incredible women who led this effort: Marlene McClintock and the Republican Women of Milton-Freewater. Viven Batties and the North Coast Republican Women. Elaine Woods and the Beaverton Hillsboro Republican Women. and Brenda Clarke and Gav Purnell from the Capitol City Republican Women. Their dedication and leadership were instrumental in driving this campaign forward. Jill Brandt of Washington County Republicans was the incredible force behind their huge success with 30 opposition statements in the voters' pamphlet.

Although we didn't reach the 600-signature mark, we are switching our opposition statement to a fee-based statement, ensuring that our message will still be heard. More importantly, this effort showcased our ability to mobilize as a statewide organization, and it provided us with a valuable opportunity to promote our values and our mission to a broader audience through the voters' pamphlet.

Looking ahead, our next endeavor will be letter-writing campaigns to non-affiliated voters on behalf of Will Lathrop for Attorney General, as well as other candidates who seek our support. This is just one of many initiatives that will continue to strengthen our presence and advance our conservative values throughout Oregon.

The Republican women in this state are truly remarkable and powerful. Together, we have proven that we can overcome challenges and make a lasting impact. Let's continue to build on this momentum and fight for the future we believe in.


